To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 80 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core courses - 30 units.
- ✓ Directed courses – 50 units
- ✓ The duration of this program is 1 year full time or part time equivalent.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 4 years.
- ✓ The above enrolment pattern is a recommended pattern only. Students who are working whilst studying would typically complete 10-20 units per term.
