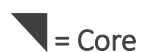

Program Plan Key:



To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 240 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core courses - 170 units.
- ✓ Directed courses - 20 units (10u chosen from Science Directed and 10u chosen from 3000 level Psychology Directed, chosen from a list of approved courses in the [Program Handbook](#)).
- ✓ Electives - 50 units. A maximum of 40 units of Elective units can be taken at 1000 level. Visit the [Course Handbook](#) to see a list of available Electives.
- ✓ Students must not exceed a total of 100 units at 1000 level.
- ✓ The duration of this program is 3 years full time study (40 units per semester) or part time equivalent.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 8 years.
