To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 240 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core courses – 230 units.
- ✓ Electives – 10 units. Visit the [Course Handbook](#) to see a list of available Electives.
- ✓ This program contains clinical/professional placements. Students must meet [NSW Health Verification Requirements](#) and obtain a WorkCover approved First Aid Certificate.
- ✓ The duration of the program is 3 years full time (students must undertake 40 units per semester).
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 5 years.
