To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 120 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core courses - 100 units.
- ✓ Directed courses - 20 units.
- ✓ The duration of this program is 3 years part time study. Due to subject prerequisites, this program cannot be completed full time.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 5 years.
- ✓ The above enrolment pattern is recommended only. Students who are working whilst studying would typically complete [10-20 units](#) per term.
- ✓ Students are able to enrol in directed courses in any term.
