

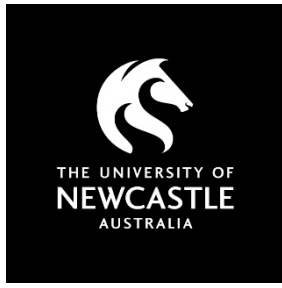

To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 120 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core Courses - 60 Units.
- ✓ Directed Courses - 60 units.
- ✓ Students who have received Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) complete 20 units of Directed courses instead of 60 units
- ✓ The approximate duration of this program is 1.5 years part-time study.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 5 years.
- ✓ The recommended intake for this program is Trimester 1.
- ✓ The above enrolment pattern is a recommended pattern only. Students who are working whilst studying would typically complete 10-20 units per term.
- ✓ Student are able to enrol in Directed Courses in *any* term.
