To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 80 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Specialisation - All compulsory courses and the required number of directed courses must be completed.
- ✓ Students can complete the requirements of up to two specialisations.
- ✓ Students enrolled in the Educational Research Specialisation must take EDUC6026 Minor Thesis A before taking EDUC6027 Minor Thesis B. These courses are taken in consecutive semesters and cannot be taken concurrently.
- ✓ Where a 40 unit specialisation also allows 40 units of electives, they can be completed in any one of three ways: (1) 40 units of courses selected from ANY directed list within the Master of Educational Studies program; (2) Completion of a second specialisation within the Master of Educational Studies (including the compulsory courses for that specialisation); or (3) Courses from outside the Master of Educational Studies program with the permission of their Program Convenor.
- ✓ The duration of this program is 1 year full time or part time equivalent.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 4 years.
