Living on campus

Student Living offers nine residences - eight at our Newcastle Callaghan campus and one at our Central Coast Ourimbah campus. When you live with us, you will join 1,800 students from around the globe in secure, affordable, and comfortable on-campus accommodation. Choose from self-contained apartments to dormitory style rooms, all with shared facilities like common rooms, cinema rooms and swimming pools, which bring our community together.

For our Newcastle Callaghan campus residents, you have the option of choosing from catered living or self-catered rooms with communal kitchens. Regardless of which residence you choose, you are able to opt into hot cooked dinners seven nights a week through a meal plan.

City Campus Student Accommodation

Currently under construction, the new City Campus Student Accommodation in Newcastle CBD will offer a variety of room types including micro studios, studios, twin apartments, and larger shared apartments. Each room will have kitchen and bathroom facilities (private or shared) and access to communal spaces. Residents will also enjoy access to an outdoor terrace, a large shared lounge area, common areas, and laundry and dining facilities. Finding accommodation

We understand that securing accommodation in Australia has its challenges. That is why we have dedicated on-campus accommodation places for our commencing international students. We want to help take the stress and hassle out of finding accommodation, so you can concentrate on settling in, making new friends and commencing your studies.

Cost of living

Before granting a student visa, the Australian Government Department of Home Affairs will require you to show or declare that you have enough funds to pay for your expenses while in Australia.

The Australian Government requires that international students have a minimum of A\$29,710 in demonstrated savings to stay in Australia for 12 months.¹

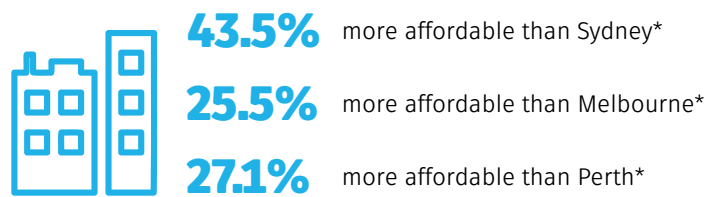

With top hospitals and research hubs just around the corner, you will dive into practical training early and start building your professional network from day one.

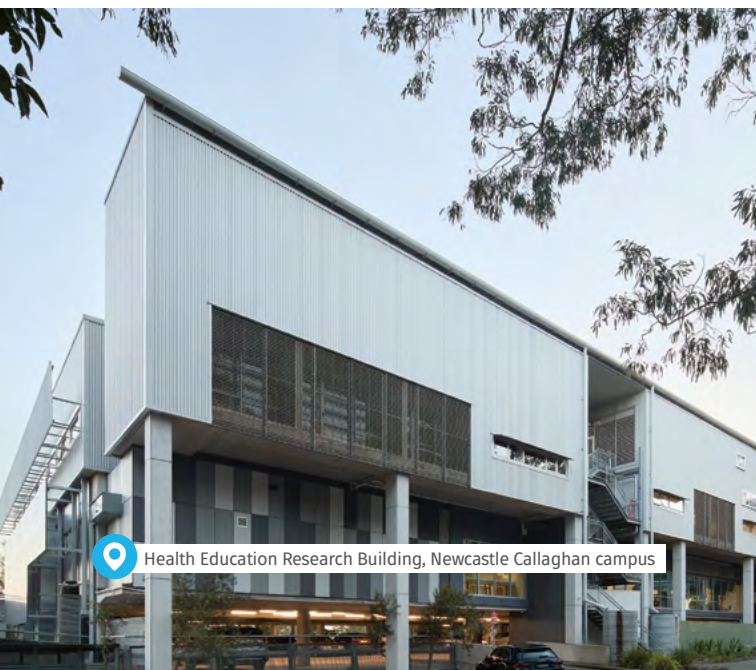
On campus, you will find cozy cafés, comfy study spots, great libraries, student support services, and lively events.

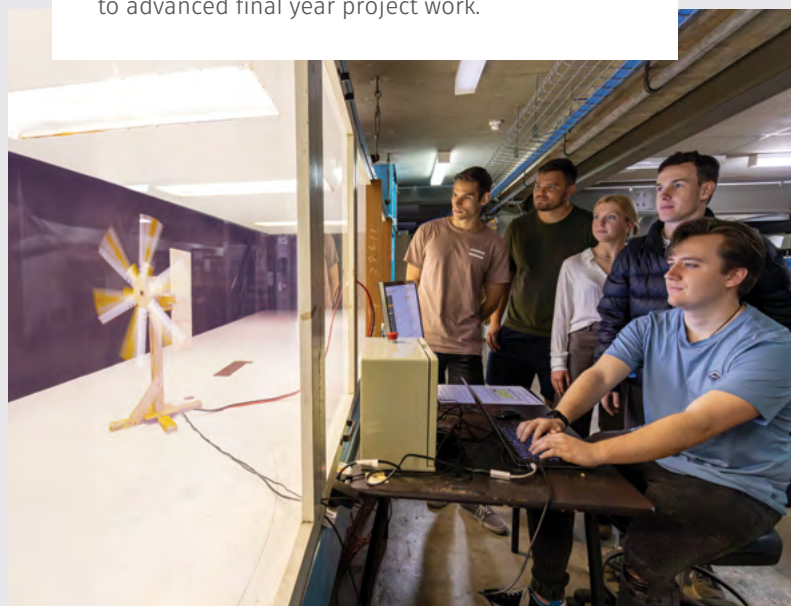

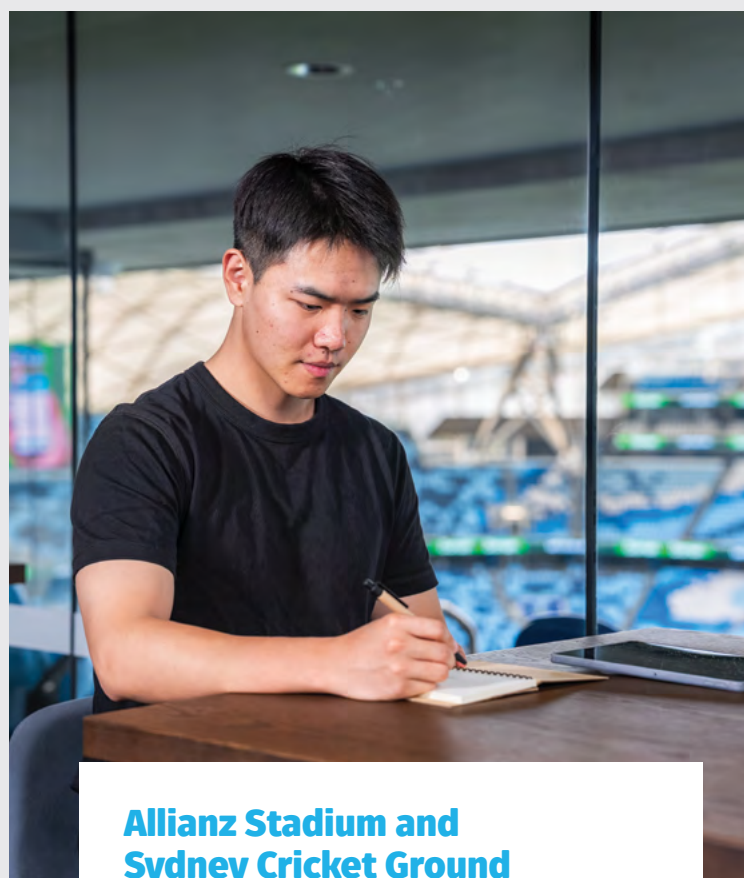

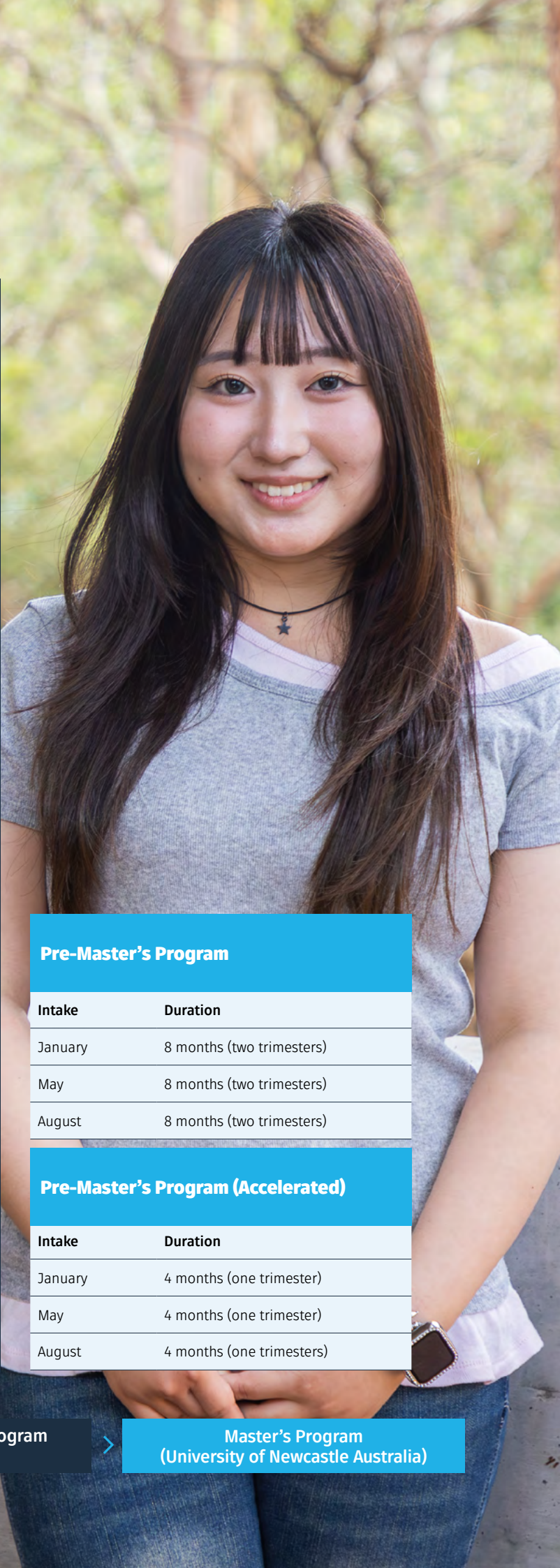
Pre-Master's Program (PMP)

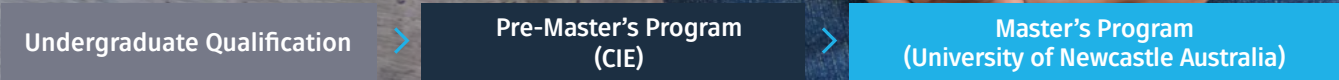

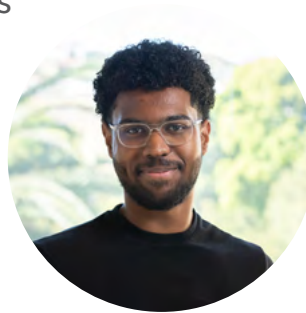

Who is the ELBP for?

The ELBP is suitable for international students who:

- Hold a conditional offer to the University of Newcastle or CIE and require English language development
- Do not yet meet the University or CIE's English language entry requirements
- Want to improve their academic English in a university environment before starting a university degree.

International students can also apply to study standalone ELBP up to 40 weeks.

The program focuses on developing the English language skills required for university study, including:

- Academic reading and writing
- Listening and note-taking skills
- Academic speaking and presentations
- Critical thinking and participation in tutorials
- Understanding academic culture and expectations.

Successful completion of the ELBP allows eligible students to progress directly into their University of Newcastle or CIE program, subject to meeting all other admission requirements.

Study hours

Our English Language Pathways offer 20 hours of class per week. Students are expected to attend classes for 4 hours each weekday, maintain attendance above 80% and satisfy our Progress Policy.

English Language Bridging Program levels

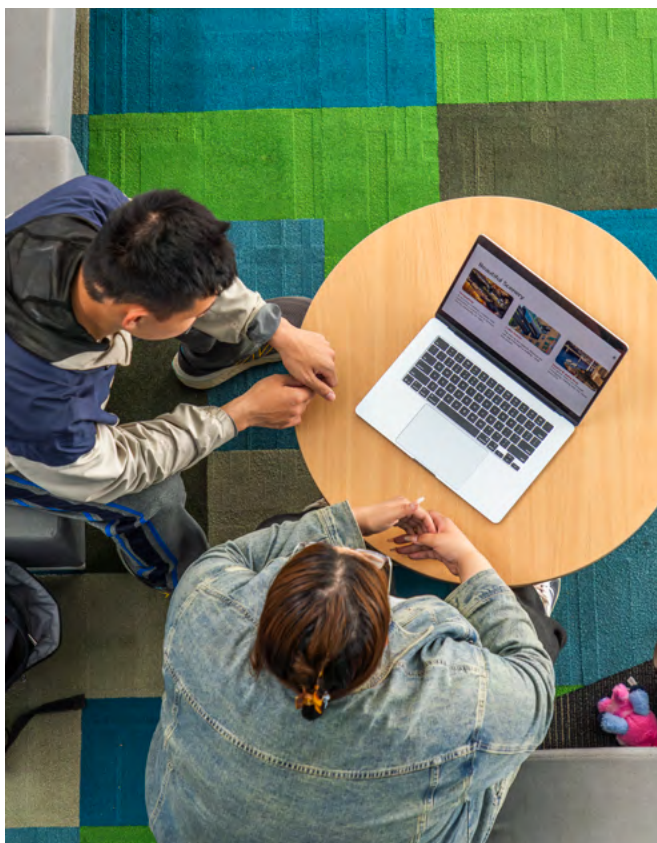

STEP 3

If you are applying through an agent, please provide your completed application form and certified documents to your agent who will submit your application on your behalf.

If you are one of our authorised agents, please ensure that you are using the Kaplink Agent Portal to lodge and manage applications. You can seek support from our System Support Officer (kaplinksupport.agents@kaplan.com), if needed.

STEP 4

Application assessment

We will review your application and supporting documents. We will send an email to you (or your agent) with an Offer of Admission if you meet our admission requirements.

If you have a conditional offer, the conditions are clearly outlined in your offer of admission.

You may also need to be assessed to determine if you are a Genuine Student under Australian legislation.

STEP 5

Accept your offer

To accept your offer, you will need to:

- Login to the Kaplink Applicant Portal at kaplink.kaplan.edu.au
- Submit any required documents to meet conditions outlined in your offer (if applicable)
- Review carefully your Offer of Admission, including Terms and Conditions.

STEP 6

Visa and Accommodation

International students will need to apply for a student visa to study in Australia. After receiving your eCoEs, please apply for your Australian student visa as early as possible. You can lodge your student visa application through ImmiAccount (immi.homeaffairs.gov.au), the official online portal managed by the Department of Home Affairs.

If applying via an agent, they will assist you with this process. To do this, your nominated agent or representative will need to create an ImmiAccount.

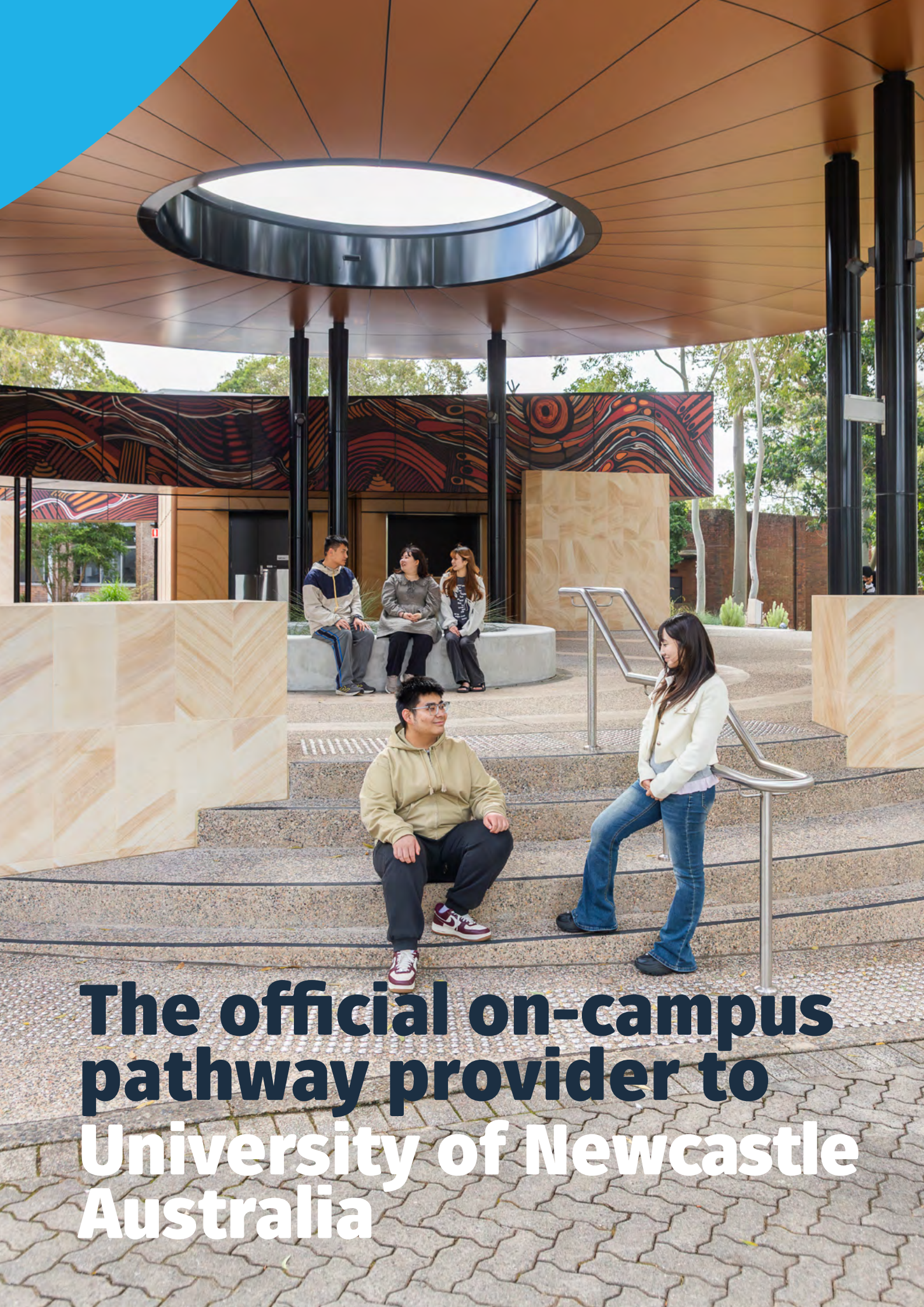
