

# FACULTY OF BUSINESS AND LAW KENYA IMMERSION EXPERIENCE Semester 2, 16 September - 2 October 2016

## The Faculty of Business and Law in conjunction with the Department of Education and Training has organised a 17 day fully escorted Kenya Immersion Experience during the 2016 semester 2 break.


Students will need to be enrolled and participate is BUSN3600 International Study Experience. Participation will include formal lectures and information sessions prior to departure, lectures at partner institutions in Kenya, lectures and debriefings upon return to Newcastle and the completion of several assessment items. Successful applicants will be batch enrolled in a special Semester 2 offering of this course by the Faculty.

This course is offered to ten 2nd and 3rd year Bachelor of Business or Bachelor of Commerce students. Student will undertake studies associated with resource management and its challenges in a developing country context while engaging in an exciting itinerary of activites. Students will visit urban and rural regions and engage with government, business and industry during the course of their stay. A highlight will be interaction with other Kenyan students at the University of Moi, Eldoret.

Day 15	Eldoret to Nairobi
Day 16	Nairobi to Sydney
Day 17	Arrive Sydney

#### CONDITIONS

• Students applying must have completed at least 120 units (12 courses) of study in either the Bachelor of Commerce or Bachelor of Business by the beginning of Semester 2, 2016.

- Students must be in Australia when applying for the Program
- Consent from grant recipients MUST be given to allow your personal details to be given to the Australian Government.
- Be willing and able to enrol in and complete BUSN3600.

#### NOTES:

- Students are encouraged to attend one of two information sessions to be held on Tuesday 12 from 12-1 in SR202 and 19 April in SRG21.
- Students may need an elective available for Semester 2, 2016
- Students who are selected to participate in the tour will be enrolled as a group into BUSN3600 International Study Experience for Semester 2, 2016.
- All successful applicants will be expected to travel to Kenya and return to Australia as one party.
- Independent travel separate to the Immersion Experience is not allowed.
- Students must attend all course work modules and information sessions in Australia and Kenya.
- Students must be Australian Citizens with a current Australian Passport that is valid until at least April 2017.
- To be eligible for OS Help loan, students must have at least 1 unit of study left to complete on their return from Kenya see above link.
- Credit for participation will be awarded by the University of Newcastle on the condition students comply with all formal course
