To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 320 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core courses - 170 units (30 Arts) (140 Music); **and**
- ✓ Directed Courses - 20 units (selected from the Bachelor of Music/Bachelor of Arts [Program Handbook](#)); **and one of the following:**
 - **Single Major pathway A** – Major - 80 units and Minor - 40 units and Electives – 10 units; *or*
 - **Single Major pathway B** – Major - 80 units and Electives – 50 units.
- ✓ Students must complete a minimum of 40 units at all levels (1000, 2000, 3000, 4000, and 5000 level), and can complete a maximum of 120 units at 1000 level.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 10 years.
- ✓ The duration of this program is 4 years full time study (40 units per semester) or part time equivalent.
