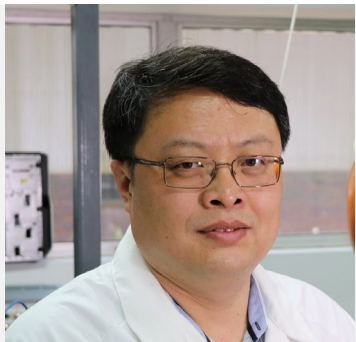
CANDIDATE STATEMENTS
