Equity, diversity, inclusion, and freedom of expression are foundational to the Ma & Morley Scholarship Program. The Program remains committed to supporting Scholars in expressing their identities, beliefs, and experiences—particularly those from underrepresented or marginalised groups—while fostering a culture of mutual respect, curiosity, and learning.

How the Program Puts These Principles Into Practice

Supporting Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Students

Through a dedicated Indigenous category and culturally safe engagement across the broader program, the Ma & Morley Scholarship Program actively supports Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Scholars. The Program works closely with the Wollotuka Institute to ensure culturally appropriate support and leadership development.

• Affirming LGBTIQ+ Inclusion

The Program embraces LGBTIQ+ identities and works with the University's LGBT+ ALLY Network to promote visibility, belonging, and safety for Scholars. Sharing of pronouns and inclusive language is encouraged and modelled across all Program activities.

• Freedom of Expression, Grounded in Respect

Scholars are encouraged to express their political, religious, and cultural views, consistent with Australian law and the University's Code for the Protection of Freedom of Speech and Academic Freedom. While disagreement may arise, the Program champions civil discourse and the respectful exchange of ideas.

A Safe and Inclusive Environment

The Program prioritises the psychological safety and wellbeing of all Scholars, particularly those from marginalised or historically excluded communities.

• Clarifying Representation

While the Program supports Scholar expression, it does not endorse any viewpoint. Scholar perspectives are individual and personal, and do not represent the official views of the Ma & Morley Scholarship Program or the University.
