## **PARTNERSHIP CAPABILITIES**

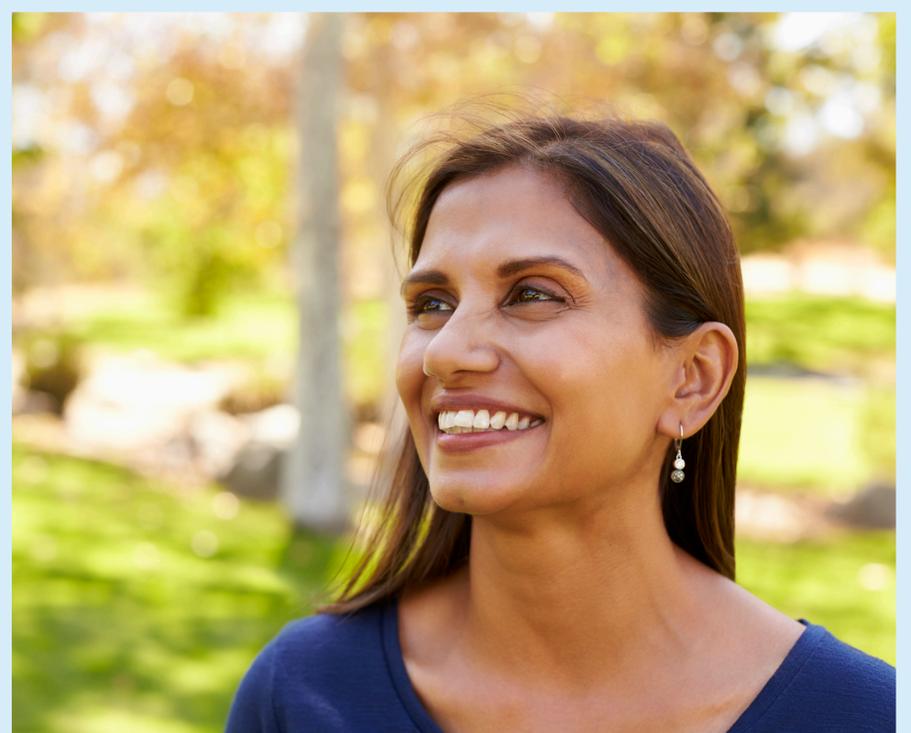
- Australian Longitudinal Study on Women's Health (ALSWH)

## **PROVEN IMPACT**

- Houses ALSWH with 30 years of data from 57,000 women
- Research findings inform government policy development, NGO inquiries, policy reviews, guidelines and intervention development for practice
- ALSWH data utilised to publish over 795 papers in national and international scientific journals

## **USING HEALTH DATA TO INFORM DECISION-MAKING**

The Australian Longitudinal Study on Women's Health (ALSWH) is a longitudinal population-based survey which examines the health of a large national sample of Australian women. ALSWH is the largest project of its kind ever conducted in Australia and has an international reputation for its multidisciplinary methodology. Since 1996, ALSWH research has been widely used by the Australian Government for policy and practice development in health and social service delivery.
