Description

The learning agreement will be developed in the first weeks of semester in consultation with the course coordinator. A template will be provided on Canvas.

This learning agreement inclusive of your project aim will identify and outline tasks you will complete to gain the knowledge required to complete this course and the final report.

Based on the variation in projects that contribute to NURS3105, it is important that in your learning agreement you identify which component of your project will be the focus of your final written assessment (critical analysis of the literature). For some students, a critical analysis of literature may align directly with their project aim, for others the critical analysis of literature may be an activity which underpins their aim. Ensure you have clearly outlined what the focus of this written assessment is in your learning agreement so you can receive feedback on your progress.

The learning agreement will:

- Identify the overarching aim you would like to achieve by participating in the project;
- Identify up to six (6) activities (or steps taken) to facilitate the achievement of your aim;
- Set out a timeline of completion for each activity;
- Provide a rationale for your aim in relation to the degree you are undertaking (including at least two (2) references).

Assessment 2 - PowerPoint Presentation

Assessment Type

Presentation

Description

Students will develop and present a PowerPoint presentation – as identified by your project supervisor.

You will prepare a PowerPoint presentation. This may be submitted as a narrated PowerPoint presentation. Some projects will require the PowerPoint to be presented in a group setting/or conference as part of the activity – this will be outlined on Canvas.

Based on the variation in projects that contribute to NURS3105, it is important that in your PowerPoint you identify the progress of your final written assessment (critical analysis of the literature). For some students, a critical analysis of literature may align directly with their project aim, for others the critical analysis of literature may be an activity which underpins their aim. Ensure you have clearly outlined what the focus of this written assessment in your PowerPoint so you can receive feedback on your progress.

Students who are presenting at a Conference will be required to present their conference oral presentation for assessment 2.

The oral presentation should:

- 1. Outline in detail (more details than provided in learning plan) the project aim and related activities
- 2. Describe your progress (this should include relevant literature)
- Description of challenges and successes.

Your presentation should:

- Include no more than ten (10) slides
- Be no longer than ten (10) minutes
- Include a Title slide, Conclusion slide and Reference slide (as part of the ten (10) slides)

Assessment 3 – Written Assessment

Assessment Type

Report.

Description

The purpose of this assessment is to provide an in-depth exploration of contemporary and relevant literature related to your project topic.

Based on the variation in projects, it is important that you identify what component of your project will be the focus of your written assessment (critical analysis of the literature). For some students, a critical analysis of literature may be part of their project aim, for others the critical analysis of literature may be an activity which underpin their aim. Ensure you have clearly outlined what the focus of this written assessment is in your learning agreement and power point so you can receive feedback on your progress.

Your written assessment should include the following headings:

Introduction - approx. 150words

Provide a brief introduction to the assessment, highlighting the overall aim of the project including the significance to your profession (consider the rationale you used for the learning agreement) and provide a detailed outline of what will be presented in this written assessment.

Critical Analysis approx. 1200 words

Describe and provide critical analysis of the literature.

Conclusion - approx. 150words

Quality - referencing, academic writing - work is referenced and clear, logical
