# **OVERVIEW**

## **Course Description**

The main component of the Honours program is an original research project on a topic relevant to nursing/midwifery practice, conducted under the close supervision of an academic staff member. In this Course the student will need to work with their supervisor/s to develop a research question and then develop the proposal for their project. The student will acquire the skills of developing a research proposal and an ethics application. They will be required to explore and develop skills in the application of research methods relevant to the research project they are undertaking. They will be required to identify a research problem, select an appropriate research technique and describe the associated ethical considerations. The student will be required to present a seminar on their identified research design and method.

This Course is only available to students enrolled in the Bachelor of Nursing (Honours) [10954], Bachelor of Midwifery (Honours) [12330] or the Bachelor of Health Science (Honours) [11691] programs.

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### **ASSESSMENT 1 - RESEARCH PROBLEM & METHODS PAPER**

Assessment Type

Written Assignment

**Purpose** 

The purpose of this assignment is to 1) demonstrate an understanding of the two major research paradigms that underpin health research - qualitative or quantitative methodologies; 2) identify a problem or issue that you will be exploring in your Honours research; 3) develop a question to help answer the problem; and 4) justify the chosen approach to answering the question.

**Description** 

When a clinical problem is identified, it is better addressed by either a qualitative or a quantitative approach (and sometimes both – mixed methods), depending on the question/ s that need to be answered.

In the paper,

- 1. Identify and briefly explain the background and significance of one problem/issue you would like to investigate. Background includes previous research on this issue.
- 2. State the approach you will take, either a qualitative or a quantitative approach, giving an aim (or objectives) for your research, as well as a specific research question.
- 3. For your chosen approach, provide a brief justification as to why the chosen approach is the most appropriate to address the proposed research question.
- 4. Provide a justification as to why the alternative approach is not appropriate.
- 5. Describe and justify the specific study design (e.g., phenomenology; observational study; experimental study) that might be most appropriate for the question and state why other methods within that approach may not be appropriate.
- 6. Briefly describe the sample size and procedures, the data collection method, and data analysis plan.

The presentation should contain the key areas outlined in the written research proposal to be submitted in Assessment 3. Students will make an oral presentation and

submit the presentation file.

**Purpose** The purpose of this assessment is to prepare a written research proposal which includes a

detailed plan to answer a specific research question.

**Description**This proposal should link the problem with the question and the approach to answer the question, so that it is methodologically sound and rigorous. It should be logical and coherent

and should include elaboration or discussion of the following components:

Background and significance of the problem

• Research question, or study aims or objectives

 Methodological approach: The selected paradigm and its justification; revised based on feedback from Assessment 1

 Methodological approach also includes The methodological approach/study design, justification revised based on feedback from Assessment 1

The study aims and objectives

 Your methods: setting, sampling and sample, sample size, recruitment, study procedures and measures, data collection, data management and data analysis

Inclusion and exclusion criteria

Other essential considerations related to your specific methodology

Strengths and limitations of the study design

Ethical considerations

Rigour appropriate for approach
