Purpose	To present progress on your research project to other research students, their supervisors and other academics in a succinct and logical manner.		
Description	The presentation should focus on presenting information on relevant data collection and proposed data analysis and interpretation, including strengths and limitations of the research. The presentation should be limited to 20 minutes including up to 5 minutes for questions from the audience. There should be a maximum of 20 slides. The presentation should be clear and logical, and the student should invite questions and feedback from the audience at the end of the presentation.
