OVERVIEW

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Course Description	The main component of the Honours program is an original research project conducted under the close supervision of an academic staff member. In this course the student will need to work under the guidance of their supervisor/s to finalise their project with a clear and coherent written report. This report will demonstrate a sound understanding of the research process and the ability to report the outcomes of the project in a scholarly manner
Requisites	This course is only available to students enrolled in the Bachelor of Nursing (Honours) [10954], Bachelor of Midwifery (Honours) [12330], Bachelor of Health Science (Honours) [11691] or Master of Philosophy (Nursing) [11653] programs.
Assumed Knowledge	A completed Bachelor of Nursing or equivalent degree, with evidence of high academic achievement and demonstrated potential to carry out, under supervision, a significant research project.
