OVERVIEW

Course Description

This core course provides Master of Nurse Practitioner students with the opportunity to understand and design their scope of practice and service model including an evaluation framework.

Students will research and synthesise clinical governance processes, legal, ethical, cultural drivers of health and advanced practice nursing provision, health policy and reforms. Students apply these determinants to Nurse Practitioner Scope of Practice and service models that focus on the provision of safe, efficient quality services including evaluation framework within the context of their clinical specialty and contemporary healthcare which will improvement in health outcomes for people and efficient, safe and quality nursing models for communities leading the advancement of nursing practice.

This course Includes Integrated Professional Practice hours and diverse clinical practice experiences, including embedded clinical supervision facilitating advanced practice nursing.

- 3. Identify and Interpret key local determinants of health that influence policy and reforms, inclusive of those that impact Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander, vulnerable populations and the diverse needs of the local community.
- 4. Critique relevant contemporary holistic healthcare service models (local models), design methodologies and principles of evidenced based practices.
- 5. Explore current Clinical Governance, Risk, Compliance, evaluation and health metrics used to measure safe, effective, quality clinical performance, business proficiency and lead practice improvement.



- 6. Interpret and integrate health informatics and technology processes within the student's clinical context, accounting for regulatory and governance (safety and risk) impacts and practice improvements.
- 7. Design and evaluate a Nurse Practitioner Scope of Practice and Service Model relevant to the student's clinical context and responsive to the workplace environment by critical analysis of the body of evidence.

REFERENCING

Your assessments must be appropriately referenced. Assessments that are not correctly referenced may have lower marks awarded.

What should be referenced?

All sources of published information including textbooks, journal articles, course readings, websites, guidelines, policies government documents that have been used to prepare an assessment MUST be included in the assessment as an intext citation AND on the reference list.

Any documents provided to you to use in the preparation of an assessment must be referenced. Direct quotes MUST be referenced. However, please note direct quotes should be used sparingly and should not normally constitute more than 10% of an assessment.

Information that you have paraphrased in your assessment must also be referenced. Correct citation of sources and referencing is expected in scholarly writing at Masters level. Assessments that are not correctly referenced may be penalised (lower marks awarded).

Assessment 1 - Literature Search Nurse Practitioner Practice Development Part A

Assessment Type

Written Assignment

Purpose

This assessment supports you to explore the body of evidence, core nursing theories, and the legal, and ethical practices underpinning Nurse Practitioner Scope and Standards of Practice. The aim is to broaden your understanding of the Nurse Practitioner (NP) practice/role and the development which has occurred, which will assist you to develop your own scope of practice and your ability to articulate how this role differs from other advance practice roles.

Description

For this assessment, you are required to explore the current literature on practice development as it relates to the Nurse Practitioner (NP) role. The literature must include relevant peer-reviewed research which is likely to include clinical guidelines, journal articles, and models of care which inform the NP role. Ideally you will apply this to your area of practice.

Choose either:

- The NP scope of practice. This could include development of the role, legislation, PBS/MBS and/or service delivery, i.e. for culturally diverse and vulnerable populations (CALD) or Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.
- The NP model of care aligning with one of the health priorities in Australia (please specify which one). The health priorities in Australia include: arthritis and musculoskeletal conditions, asthma, cancer, cardiovascular, diabetes mellitus, mental health, dementia and obesity.

Assessment structure:

Title: Chosen topic A or B

Introduction (approximately 150 words): Provide a brief Introduction to the topic



Literature Search (approximately 400 words): Summary of search strategies / databases searched, use of Boolean techniques; and inclusion/exclusion criteria. The search strategy is an iterative process and will require time to test search terms to yield useful literary papers.

This may be presented in a table.

Summary (approximately 200 words): The final section of your assessment should briefly summarise your search findings and provide a rationale for the selection of your five articles for Assessment 2.

Assessment 2 - Annotated Bibliography for Nurse Practitioner Practice Development Part B

Assessment Type

Annotated Bibliography

Purpose

This assessment allows you to build on assessment 1 and helps to support your ability to critically analyse the body of evidence on the Nurse Practitioner Scope and Standards of Practice, identify key local determinants of health that influence policy and reforms, and critique relevant contemporary holistic healthcare service models (local models), design methodologies and principles of evidenced based practices.

Description

To clearly ground your discussion on practice, select five articles from your literature search for the chosen topic in Assessment 1 that are directly related to practice development of the Nurse Practitioner (NP) role and will inform your scope of practice.

Your articles should evaluate whether there is literature to support the nurse practitioner role in your context and include discussion of relevant legislation, policy, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health issues, clinical guidelines, NP models of care and or service models that are relevant. Discuss how these concepts will be incorporated into your own Scope of Practice and service model to support and improve outcomes for people in your service and local area.

The annotated bibliography should include the following for each source:

- The full citation
- The main premise of the literary source.
- Include critical comment for each of the selected literatures (see the example of an annotation in Canvas).
 - Consider whether the source is currently relevant or topical?
 - Is there influence in policy and reforms inclusive of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander, vulnerable populations and diverse needs of the local community?
 - Are the concepts acceptable? If not, why not?
 - Are there methodological weaknesses, logic errors, or other inadequacies? Is the paper well-developed?



Provide a brief summary of your conclusions on the article

Discussion and Summary: The final section of the assessment should discuss and summarise your findings based on these five articles. It should evaluate whether there is literature to support the nurse practitioner role in your context and include relevant legislation, policy, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health issues, clinical guidelines, NP models of care and or service models that are relevant.

Purpose

To develop your Nurse Practitioner (NP) Scope of Practice (ScOP) and Model of Care inclusive of an evaluation framework contextualised to your clinical area and community.

Description

This assessment item requires you to develop your Nurse Practitioner (NP) Scope of Practice (ScOP) and Model of Care inclusive of an evaluation framework contextualised to your clinical area and community.

To develop your ScOP, service model and evaluation framework you will draw on the literature search conducted in previous assessments. You do not need to include your search strategy in this report.

Present this work in a report format (scholarly essay). The report should be written at a level to present to senior management in support of a NP service to be implemented within your organisation.

Report structure: The report must include the following sections. A template is provided and must be used:

- Title
- Contents Page
- Overview of proposal
- Description of proposed NP service including:
 - Scope of Practice
 - Proposed Service Model
 - Evaluation Framework
- Summary and Recommendations

References using APA 7th referencing style (not included in the word count).

NOTE: This is a scholarly report and will require in-text referencing throughout

Description

Completed IPP timesheets totalling 220 hrs submitted in SONIA; three ANSAT NP (one assessment each 80 hours).

Required Integrated Professional Practice of 220 Hours on timesheets in SONIA. Students are responsible for ensuring that all clinical practice documents are correctly and completely filled out and signed contemporaneously, i.e. Before the IPP period is concluded. Names and signatures must be very clear and legible. Clinical supervisors are not able to complete clinical documentation retrospectively.

Satisfactory completion of the ANSAT NP (Australian Nursing Standards Assessment Tool Nurse Practitioner): Assessment of clinical practice against NMBA Nurse Practitioner Standards for Practice is required at the completion of each 80 hours (approx.).

The ANSAT NP form completion and submission of these documents is the responsibility of the student.

Supervisor/s must sign off on each document including all timesheets and ANSAT NP documents in SONIA and the Course Portfolio.

IMPORTANT: ANSAT NP documents and Time Sheets are legal documents. Legal documentation requirements must be followed, this includes:

- Applying a single line to an error (correction fluid or tape is not permitted)
- All errors need to be acknowledged with your supervisors initial
- ANSAT NP or Timesheets that do not adhere to these requirements or not submitted by completion of the IPP or ANSAT NP experience will not be accepted and will place the student at risk of failure based on a failure to complete compulsory requirements
