PSYC3002: Work Integrated Learning in Psychology

OVERVIEW

Course Description

It is time to apply your theory of psychology to the real world. This course requires students to integrate key concepts and best practice theory with practical workplace placement experience. As part of this course, students will undertake work-related placement activities to position themselves for a career after graduation. This consists of combining theory with work-integrated experiential learning supported by online learning modules, workshops, and career guidance.

Students may undertake their Work Integrated Learning (WIL) placements in a broad range of key WIL areas such as Non-Government Organisations, community and volunteer organisations, industry and research laboratories. Students who have successfully completed 160 units at 1000, 2000 or 3000 level (or at the discretion of the Course Coordinator), will be allocated to placements by the Course Coordinator and their preferences may be taken into account. In some cases, students may source their own placements if approved by the Course Coordinator.

Assessment 1 - Online Quiz

Assessment Type Quiz

Description Students are required to complete an online Careers Module that covers essential

requirements for the workplace including responsibilities and standards, WHS issues, ethical considerations, etc. This content will be assessed in a multiple-choice quiz on Canvas.

The Quiz must be attempted and passed before the student is allocated to a placement.

Assessment Criteria Students will answer 20 multiple choice questions based on the online module. Each question

will be worth 0.5 marks towards their final grade. Students must pass this quiz in order to be allocated a placement. Two attempts will be given to each student. Students will have the

option to repeat the guiz if they do not pass during their first two attempts.

Question by question feedback will be made available after all students have completed the

quiz.

Assessment 5 - Journal

Purpose The purpose of the Journal is for students to demonstrate recording skills, accurate record

keeping practices and regular reporting procedures in a timely manner; recognize and reflect on the difference between expected and actual outcomes; demonstrate critical thinking; and

communicate in writing with confidence.

Description The purpose of the journal is for students to demonstrate accurate recording keeping

practices, as well as critical thinking, ethical considerations, and reflective writing style.

Length 3,000 words Word limits include headings, sub-heading, in-text citations, quotes and

referencing but does not include the list of references, appendices and footnotes. The word limit will allow a tolerance of 10% and any work after the maximum word limit will not be included within the allocation of marks. In other words, the marker will STOP reading at 3300

words.
