OVERVIEW

Course Description

Students undertake supervised face-to-face clinical experience with child speech pathology caseloads. Clinical experience placements are usually in speech pathology student units in health, education, or on-campus outpatient settings and attendance for one day (8.00am - 5pm) each week will be required for the period allocated. (Note that placements typically include attendance outside the semester). One hour a week will be spent in tutorials on-campus during the semester period to assist with the preparation for clinical placement experiences and to facilitate transferability and integration of academic and clinical knowledge.

Academic Progress Requirements

This course is a compulsory program requirement and is monitored for academic progress purposes. The course must be completed to progress in the program or meet other program requirements.

Failure or withdrawal from this course will result in students being considered under the Student Academic Progress Procedure.

Course Content

Teaching Staff

This course provides students with the opportunity to learn through clinical practice experience with paediatric populations. The student is supervised by a qualified speech pathologist. The student has the opportunity to observe and work directly with children with a range of communication needs, activity limitations and participation restrictions related to their communication. Students will be engaged in the planning and delivery of ethical, and evidence-based services for assessment and intervention of individual children and have the opportunity to participate in a range of service delivery/case management models.

- 1. Demonstrate progress from beginning levels of clinical competence to between novice and intermediate levels of competence across all units of COMPASS®.
- 2. Provision of clinical management to children with communication needs using evidence based, culturally responsive and ethical practice.

- 4. Demonstrates professional and ethical behaviour appropriate to the clinical placement setting.
- 5. Demonstrates reflective practice and critical thinking.

Must be deemed satisfactory in all criteria (Professionalism and Conduct, Technical Skills or Professional Skills) by the placement supervisor to pass the course overall indicating satisfactory progress toward competency and ethical conduct.

Your clinical placement is assessed by your Practice Educator using COMPASS® including your evaluation of your performance. This is a competency-based assessment tool designed to validly assess students' performance on clinical placements.

The judgement of competency is recorded by placing a mark on a rating line using the online web-based system (COMPASS® online) for eleven competencies. These competencies reflect the knowledge, skills and attributes a graduating speech pathology student must demonstrate and be able to apply by the time they complete their entry-level degree. For this



placement students need to reach a novice-intermediate level.
