INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS WHO COMMENCED IN THE BACHELOR OF CRIMINOLOGY/BACHELOR OF PSYCHOLOGICAL SCIENCE [40271] PRIOR TO 2023

There are changes to the program in 2023.

CRIM3001 and CRIM3010 have been removed from core course requirements. CRIM3020 has been added to the core course requirements, as well as a Work Integrated Learning component.

Transition Arrangements

Students who have **successfully completed both CRIM3001 and CRIM3010** will have both courses count towards the program requirements. These students are not required or permitted to complete CRIM3002, CRIM3020 or PSYC3002.

Students who have **not successfully completed both CRIM3001 and CRIM3010** are required to complete CRIM3020 and the Work Integrated Learning component.

Students who have **successfully completed CRIM3001 however not CRIM3010** are required to complete CRIM3010. The course will remain available for these students to complete in Semester 1, 2023.

Students who have **successfully completed CRIM3010 however not CRIM3001** are required to complete CRIM3001. The course will remain available for these students to complete in Semester1, 2023.
