

DIPLOMA IN ARTS AND SOCIAL SCIENCE

Completing the Diploma in Arts and Social Science lets you receive up to:

- 80 units of credit into the Bachelor of Arts
- 80 units of credit into the Bachelor of Communication
- 80 units of credit into the Bachelor of Criminology
- 80 units of credit into the Bachelor of Development Studies
- 80 units of credit into the Bachelor of Global Indigenous Studies
- 80 units of credit into the Bachelor of Social Science

Whether you can receive the full amount of credit will depend on which directed courses you complete in the Diploma in Arts and Social Science and which Bachelor degree program you choose.
