Transition Arrangements

The following description outlines the approved transition arrangements for students who commenced in the Graduate Certificate in Custodial Health program prior to 2024. Students who commence the program in 2024 onwards must complete the courses and follow the program structure that is outlined in the Program Handbook.

Primary Health Care (Core)

Replacement Courses

NURS6301

Cultural Context of Custody (Core)

First offered Trimester 2 2024

If you have previously completed NURS6801:

You are able to count this as either a core course in place of NURS6301. You will not need to take new core course NURS6301 Cultural Context of Custody.

If you have not yet completed NURS6801:

You will need to take new course, NURS6301 Cultural Context of Custody, as a core course from 2024 onwards.

Frequently Asked Questions

I have already completed NURS6801, do I need to complete NURS6301?

No. Students who have completed NURS6801 will not need to study NURS6301. NURS6801 will automatically continue to count towards your program requirements.
