Some of the 3000 level directed courses in the International Business major have requisites.

What is a requisite?

A requisite is a criteria that must be meet before you can enrol. Requisites can be program based, course based or condition based.

The International Business major requires students to complete 30 units of 3000 level directed courses. Students choose 30 units from a list of 6 courses:-

- ACFI3140 International Finance
- BUSN3500 International Work Placement in Business
- <u>BUSN3600 International Study Experience</u>
- ECON3003 Global Trade and Finance
- IRHR3540 International Human Resource Management
- MKTG3060 International Marketing
